Priorities

Staffing Concerns

We continue to experience staffing issues but we have made progress this week in terms of creating more time for our own teachers to take classes consistently. As a council we are meeting on Monday to discuss this further so I am hopeful that I will have some positive news to share next week. In the interim, we have Miss Maloney returning on Mondays to work with the Higher Drama pupils in preparation for their upcoming performances. We're very excited to have Miss Maloney back in school! School Security

Magnetic Locks

As mentioned in the newsletter last week, the new magnetic locks are now in place. There have of course been a few teething problems but, overall, I am really pleased with how the implementation has gone! I think once the system is fully embedded we will begin to see a real positive change. Generally, our young people have adapted really well to the doors and understand why we have them. We have been gathering feedback from pupils and staff but will let the current system run for another week before we review and make any changes. We would like to say a huge thank you to everyone who has been on hand to assist with the doors and have dealt with issues promptly.

Toilets Open During the School Day

Pupils have raised concerns that toilets have not been open during the school day. I would like to reassure them that this is not the case. During the school day the toilets outside my room and outside Mr. Shalaev's room are open. At breaks and lunchtimes the main toilets in the canteen are also open. All faculties also have a key for other disabled toilets around the school should they need to be opened during class times. Up until now there have been issues with a number of young people gathering in the toilets during class time so we are monitoring this. We just want to make sure that every young person is where they should be during school time!

Staffing

On Monday we welcome Cameron Stevenson who will be joining the Health and Wellbeing Faculty as a Teacher of PE. He will be backfilling Stephanie Hamilton when she goes on maternity leave. Mr. Stevenson is starting before Miss. Hamilton leaves to allow time for a handover. Welcome, Mr Stevenson!

Support for Learning

We are looking forward to launching a new Senior Hub for our pupils who access S4 - S6. This will provide a calm, supported space for studying, completing coursework, and preparing for assessments. The hub will promote independence, help develop young people's organisation, and support positive study habits, helping young people to meet

high expectations during an important stage of their learning. This is also exciting news for our S1–S3 pupils, who will also now have their own dedicated Support Hub. This will allow staff to provide more targeted support for younger learners, responding to individual needs.
